Nightingale College (Year 10): Food & Nutrition

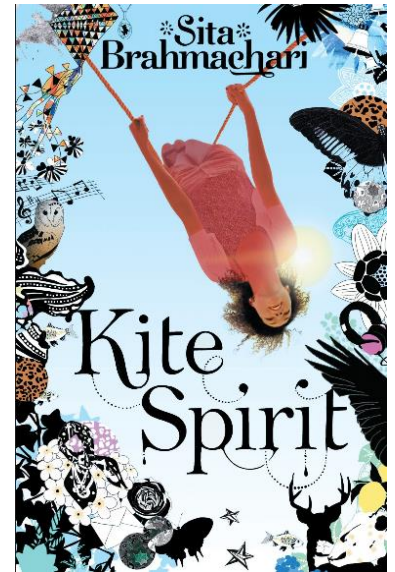
