Congratulation and Well Done

Congratulations to Mr Smith from our mathematics faculty who completed the 'Tour De Manc' ride over the Bank Holiday weekend.

The 'Tour de Manc' is a 105 mile route which goes through all 10 boroughs of Greater Manchester, it took place on Sunday, 5th May and Mr Smith took just over seven and a half hours to complete the course. During the ride there is about 8500ft of climbing, with Werneth Low and Winter Hill being the steepest. Locally, the route passed through Mossley on Huddersfield road, then went over through Saddleworth into Rochdale.

We are delighted that Mr Smith completed the ride safely and was back in school for the students. Apart from a strange walk, there seemed to be no lasting effects.

Faraday College (Year 8) Options Event: Thursday, 23rd May (5.30-6.30pm)

Our year 8 students will be making some very important choices in the coming weeks. A letter has been sent home explaining their option choices and inviting all year 8 parents to an Options Event on Thursday, 23rd May. At this stage, the year 8 students will continue to study English, maths, science, history, geography, modern foreign languages and physical education. The **only** other subjects that they will study will be those that they now choose from a selection. The booklets containing the option choices will be issued to students on Monday, 20th May. The return date for the option choices is Tuesday, 4th June.

You may be aware of the major reforms to the GCSE examinations that have taken place over the last 2 years. There is much less emphasis on coursework (i.e. work completed during the course which counts towards the examination), and much more reliance on the terminal examination at the end of the course. The result of this is that students have to sit more examinations than ever, sometimes as many as 28, in a short window at the end of

Year 11. This is the same for all students across the country. In order to alleviate some of the workload, and therefore reduce the anxiety of pupils, we have agreed with our governing body that pupils will complete one of their option subjects at the end of Year 10, freeing up time for additional support and learning wherever it is needed in Year 11.

All students will **choose 2 option subjects** at the end of Year 8; one will be taught for 2 lessons each week and will be examined in Year 11. The other option will be taught for 3 lessons each week and will be examined at the end of Year 10. There will be no difference in the number of guided learning hours for each option. Your son/daughter will continue to study English, maths, science, history, geography, modern foreign languages and physical education. The **only** other subjects that they will study will be those that they now choose from the lists in the options booklet. The subjects, where the course will run in year 9 and 10, are clearly identified in this booklet as one option.

The event on the 23rd May has been planned with the aim of giving you, as parents and carers, guidance so that we can work together in supporting your child. Given the importance of these decisions, our students will also want to take into consideration how well they are doing in each subject, how much they enjoy it and how it fits in with any future career aspirations that they may have, to ensure that they make the right choice. It should be a decision decided as a family based on what is best for them and should not be influenced by choices that friends may be making. For that reason, we want to ensure that you are given as much information as possible and have the opportunity to ask any questions. We are holding an information event on the 23rd May.

The event will take place between 5.30-6.30pm. Families will not be expected to stay for the whole hour, you may wish to attend to listen the information or to ask questions. The details are below:

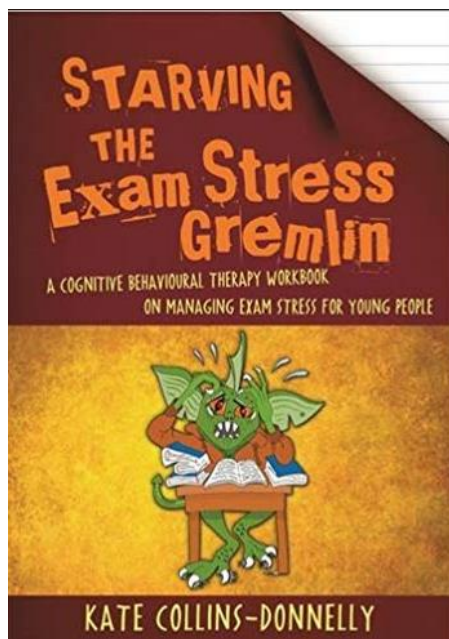

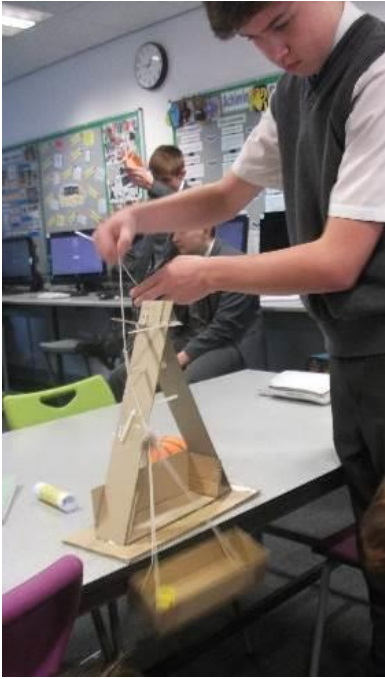
