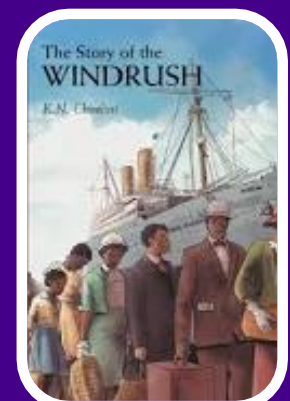

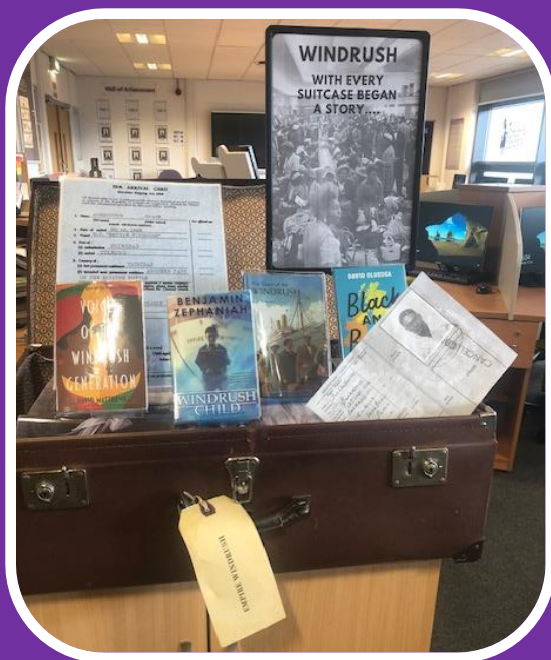
Combines historical fact with voices from the Windrush Generation, tells the inspiring story of the Windrush Generation and ideal for struggling readers, with full colour illustration.
